Generic Professional Capabilities [GPCs]

Collect evidence for the 7 GPC domains throughout each stage of training. Wait until the end of a stage of training before submitting HALOs for these domains.

ACCS 1 and ACCS 2

Overview guide to ACCS Year Two

ACCS Year One

- Placements in acute and emergency medicine during ACC\$1.
- Work towards GPCs and ACCS learning outcomes.

ACCS Year Two

- 6 months in anaesthetics to achieve the <u>Initial assessment of competence [IAC]</u>
 and the procedural sedation HALO.
- 6 months in ICM to achieve the <u>ICM</u> HALO.
- Work towards GPCs.

ACCS 3 and ACCS 4

[also known as Angesthetic CT2 & CT3]

Overview guide to ACCS Year 3 [CT2]

- Initial Assessment of Competence in Obstetric Anaesthesia [IACOA] achieved during ACC\$3 [CT2].
- Experience of specialist areas to evidence via triple-c forms:
 - Paediatric anaesthesia.
- Additional obstetric experience
- HALOs for the Regional Anaesthesia and Pain domains and the Resuscitation and transfer domain.

ST4 & ST5

Overview guide to Stage 2 Training

- Work towards the regional anaesthesia. pain and procedural sedation domains.
- 3 months of ICM to achieve the ICM and Resuscitation and Transfer HALOs.
- Experience of specialist areas to evidence via triple-c forms:
 - Paediatric Anaesthesia
 - Obstetric Anaesthesia
 - Neuroangesthesia
 - Cardiothoracic Anaesthesia

ST6 & ST7

Overview guide to Stage 3 training

- Evidence the 7 clinical domains again.
- ICM HALO can be evidenced using oncall & theatre experience and doesn't require a specific ICM "block".
- Experience of specialist areas can be evidenced using triple-c forms:
 - Paediatric Anaesthesia
 - Obstetric Angesthesia
- Special interest areas [SIAs] over 12 months..

Only submit HALOs for the General Anaesthesia and the Perioperative Medicine and Health Promotion domains at the end of each stage of training [ACCS4, ST5 and ST7]
