Introduction

The following document is designed to act as a log and prompt for the achieving of the Level 2 Common Competencies. The requirement to pass the ACCS ARCP at the end of CT2 is to have 50% of these signed off.

If you are a paper based trainee then this document should be scanned and uploaded for your ARCP as evidence provided for the panel to review. The "Evidence Reviewed" column is for you to reference work other parts of the portfolio such as work based placed assessments that are relevant to demonstrating you reach the required level of competence. These can then be checked by your supervisor on signing.

If you are an eportfolio based trainee then this can act as a prompt for you and your educational supervisors as to the level you should be achieving for your stage of training. It does **NOT** need to be scanned in your case as the signing of each competence is done electronically via the portfolio.
