

ACCS3 [Anaesthetic CT2] Year at UHCW

We will have a 1:1 meeting to discuss your individual requirements when you start.

You can arrange further college tutor meetings as and when you feel necessary.

Your year should be planned in your PDP, and your progress monitored regularly with your Educational Supervisor.

Please make the college tutors and your Educational Supervisor aware of any incomplete areas of your ACCS curriculum as these will need to be addressed ASAP.

You should have completed your IAC, Procedural Sedation HALO and Intensive Care Medicine HALO as part of the first two years of the ACCS programme.

The basic format of your year will be as follows [adjusted for any LTFT working]:

1. Three months of obstetrics to achieve the initial assessment of competence in obstetric anaesthesia [IACOA].
2. Three months of regional anaesthesia and pain medicine.
3. Three months of paediatric experience evidenced with a triple-c form.
4. Three months of general theatre lists to work towards the key capabilities of the general anaesthesia and the perioperative medicine and health promotion domains.

Throughout the year, you should take Educational Development Time [EDT] in order to evidence the Generic Professional Capabilities [GPC]. This time can also be used to become involved in teaching and training, research, audit and quality improvement. You should discuss and plan for this at your Educational Supervisor meetings.

You should also work towards the Primary FRCA examination.

- Support will be provided by the department and your Educational Supervisor.
- Personal study days can be used to prepare for both components of the primary exam, but this is limited to 5 days to be spread across all sittings of both components of the primary exam across all core training placements.

The following evidence will be expected by the time of your ARCP.

Milestones
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Initial Assessment of Competence in Obstetric Anaesthesia [IACOA] <u>must</u> be completed this year.▪ HALOs for EPA 3 and EPA 4 with SLEs at a Supervision Level of 3, a logbook of appropriate cases, and a Multiple Trainer Report [MTR] in obstetrics will be required for this.
Complete the following HALOs
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Regional Anaesthesia HALO should be completed at UHCW – this will need evidence from obstetric practice.▪ Pain HALO should be completed at UHCW.
Collect evidence of Key Capabilities towards the following domains [but not complete HALOs until the end of CT4]
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ General Anaesthesia.▪ Perioperative Medicine and Health Promotion.▪ Resuscitation and Transfer – take advantage of simulation courses available [PROMPT, Paediatric airway lab].
Completion of Capability Cluster Forms [Triple-C]
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ A Paediatric Triple-C should be completed this year, and this will require an MTR in paediatrics.▪ You can start to collect evidence towards the Obstetric Triple-C/Key Capabilities after completing the IACOA, but this would ideally be completed next year after a period of on-call and more independent work.
Generic Professional Capability domains
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ All 7 GPC domains should have evidence from this year of training – achieved using your EDT.▪ A completed mandatory training matrix will go a long way towards starting to evidence this!
Additional Requirements
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ MSF x1.▪ MTR – one generic, one as part of the IACOA and one as part of the Paediatric triple-c form.▪ Involvement in at least one audit/QI project – this could be evidence with an A-QIPAT.▪ Evidence of a personal development plan with appropriate goals set and achieved.▪ A minimum of 3 supervisory meetings documented on the LLP.▪ An ESSR completed with your Educational Supervisor accompanied by a completed Form R.▪ Maintain a logbook via the LLP.▪ Attendance at Thursday morning school wide Primary FRCA teaching until completion of the Primary FRCA, after which you can attend Final FRCA Teaching.
